# † Introducing the Celestia! †

A quilt block designed to introduce sewing enthusiasts to quilting!

The Celestia is a 12 in. x 12 in. block that can be used as a placemat when the two side strips are added, making this project both fun and practical!

Feel free to use only the centrer block if you want to repeat it or use it in other contexts: for a blanket, frame, a small cushion, and so on.






# **Material**

- Quilting cotton
- Colour 1 (red): 5 in. (15 cm)
- o Colour 2 (beige): 10 in. (25 cm)
- · Colour 3 (pink): 5 in. (15 cm)
- Back: 13 in. (35 cm) Biais 1/2 po
- 1/2 in. bias tape
- \* Pre-made bias tape: 65 in. (165 cm)
- \* If you want to make your own bias tape: 10 in. (25 cm) of fabric that is 44 in. wide.
- Batting: 13 in. (35 cm)

# Accessories

- Rotary cutter
- Cutting board
- Marking pen. Our favourite is the Prym cartridge pencil.
- Basic ruler
- Quilting ruler
- · Thread for assembling
- Quilting thread
- · Sewing machine
- · Wonder clips or pins





# List of cuts



## **COLOUR 1 (RED)**

One 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. square Two 4 in. x 4 in. squares Eight 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. squares

### **COULEUR 2 (BEIGE)**

4 carrés de 4.5po x 4.5po 8 rectangles de 4.5po x 2.5po 4 carrés de 4po x 4po

### **COULEUR 3 (ROSE)**

2 carrés de 4po x 4po 8 carrés de 2.5po x 2.5po

### **BIAS TAPE**

Two strips of the fabric that are 2 in. wide (44 in.)

## **Finished size**

18 ½ in x 12 ½ in





# Making the **flying geese** blocks

Make a total of eight 4 ½ in. x 2 ½ in. flying geese pieces:

Four pieces with colours #1 and #2



**4**x

Four pieces with colours #2 and #3



**4**x

#### How to make a flying geese piece:

Use one 4 ½ in. x 2 ½ in. rectangle of colour #2

Use two 2 1/2 in. x 2 1/2 in. squares of colour #1

Follow the steps on the next page.

Make a total of four pieces.


### Repeat with colours #2 and #3 (four times)


Once your eight pieces are made, measure and trim the excess to have 4 ½ in. x 2 ½ in. shapes.

For convenience and a perfect result, we recommend using the 4 in. x 2 in. flying geese Block\_Loc.

# Making the half-square triangle blocks

Make a total of eight 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. unfinished half-square triangle pieces :



#### How to make a half-square triangle piece:

Use one 4 in. x 4 in. square of colour #1 Use one 4 in. x 4 in. square of colour #2

Follow the steps on the next page.

Make a total of four pieces.


#### Repeat with colours #2 and #3 (four times)

Once your two squares are made, we recommend you measure them and trim the excess if necessary to ensure you have 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. squares.

For convenience and a perfect result, we recommend you use the 6 ½ in. half-quarter-square triangle Bloc\_Loc.




# Half-square triangle






# **Assembling the quilt**
